#### Cindy Bo's Young Toddlers

Thank you to all my Young Toddler Families, who were able to attend our "Back To School Night". I really enjoyed that time with you! I want to support you in whatever way I can. I would love to share a couple resources, that may be helpful to you parents and family members of young toddlers. "1,2,3, The Toddler Years" by Irene Van der Zande and "No Bad Kids" by Janet Lansbury, are both great books, that I would be happy to loan out. Also, I would be willing to set up a monthly meeting, to present and discuss practical application of some basic RIE principles, in caring for Toddlers. I will send home a survey on whether this would be of interest to anyone and, if so, what day and time might work best for you. In September, we will continue to focus on getting to know each other better, helping each child develop their sense of belonging and significance as part of our group. I will continue to focus on providing predictability in your child's day and helping them to develop a sense of security, by establishing consistent and familiar routines and boundaries. Many of the children are already feeling safe and secure enough to test those boundaries. If you notice this at home too, know that this is a good and healthy thing. Just remember that consistency and follow-through are very important! This month, I will provide opportunities for the children to explore their similarities and differences, as they are showing more and more interest in each other. I will also introduce concepts associated with the exploration of apples. I will soon be sending home a little white "Apple Bag" for your child to bring an apple back to school in, for us to explore. We will explore their similarities and differences, discover the star in the middle, enjoy tasting them and make applesauce together. If you, or an adult family member, are able to help out in the classroom with this morning cooking project, please let me know.
