2016 was a very busy year, with many fun filled events, that fostered learning and friendships. I extend a heartfelt "THANK YOU" to all the families that have chosen our program. It is our desire to provide the best of quality care, to children, by offering a low child to teacher ratio and an environment that is enriching, both inside and outside the classroom. The "National Association for the Education of Young Children" (NAEYC) sets the standards of quality, which we follow, and which continues to guide our staff. Also, our program will be participating in the "Quality Counts" program, provided through the Child Care Planning Council. This program will offer our staff continued education opportunities, as well as stipends for their professional and educational achievements.

We have two upcoming family fun events planned. The first event will be a "Parent's Night Out" on Saturday, January 28, from 5-8 PM. The cost will be \$20 per child, for three hours of child care (see the attached flier for details). Our second event will be the "Pizza Dinner and Rain Gutter Regatta Races", on Friday, February 24. This event will start at 6:30 PM, with dinner, and the races will begin around 7:00 PM. Both events will help raise funds needed for staff to attend the "California Association for the Education of Young Children" (CAEYC) conference in Ontario, California. In addition, these events provide our families with a wonderful time to have fun, build new friendships, and strengthen the heart of our school community.

The Fall Survey results are in. 80% of surveys collected noted that families were "very satisfied" and 20% were "satisfied", overall, with our program. The number one reason why families chose our program was for the "age appropriate curriculum" and the second two reasons were for our "low child to teacher ratio" and the environments: both inside and outside.
