We hope you will share your summer time fun (with us, by bringing in pictures or souvenirs to share, from your family travels.




Summer is a busy time for many families, as well as for the staff. Please let your child's teacher know if your child will not be coming to school, because of vacation or due to illness. Teachers record absences, related to illness, on their classroom illness log.

We appreciate your support in helping to keep everyone healthy. A well balanced diet, plenty of rest and regular hand washing are KEY to happy and healthy children, families, and staff. We ask, at the beginning of each day, that your child uses the hand sanitizer or washes his/her hands when they enter the program. Reason being, as we travel from place to place, we also bring with us germs. It is also good practice to use the hand sanitizer before leaving the facility. This will help prevent taking home any additional germs, that may have been picked up, while at school. Also, please review the visual aid, handwashing sheet, for proper handwashing methods.

What makes Arroyo Grande United Methodist Children's Center different from other child care centers? We offer a low child to teacher ratio having a 4:1 ratio in our toddler program and a 6:1 ratio in our preschool and pre k program. We pride ourselves on having a quality program that offers an emergent curriculum. Emergent Curriculum is socially and intellectually engaging and personally meaningful to the children. Our staff follows the lead of the children and introduces new and exciting activities, to sustain the child's interest, over a period of time.
